Dr. Mark G. Belcik is the Associate Dean of the Wanda L Bass School of Music at Oklahoma City University, a position he has held since 2001. He holds degrees in Music Education from The University of Michigan, a Master's in Horn Performance from The University of Oklahoma and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Instrumental Conducting from The University of Texas at Austin. Dr. Belcik's teaching experiences include appointments at the University of Texas at Austin, where he was the Associate Director of the Longhorn Band, the University of New Mexico, Valdosta State University, Bear Creek High School (CO) and Ardmore High School (OK). His high school bands have earned national

recognition and won sweepstakes awards in Oklahoma and Colorado. Dr. Belcik is an active clinician, judge and guest conductor. He has conducted All State and Honor Bands in several states and has presented clinics at State, Regional and National Conventions. He currently serves as the Principal Conductor and Music Director of the Oklahoma City Symphonic Band, and is past President of the Oklahoma Association of Music Schools. He is on the board of the Oklahoma Youth Orchestra and Oklahoma Concert Band Foundation.



Dr. Ryan Sharp is currently Associate Professor of Trumpet at the University of Central Oklahoma. Artistic Director of the Frontier Brass Band, and an international award-winning soloist. Rvan has twice won the Gateshead MBC Trophy for Outstanding Soprano Cornet at the Brass in Concert Championships held every November in Gateshead, England. He enjoys an active performing schedule spanning many other genres such as solo. chamber, orchestral, jazz, salsa, and pop. He has performed with the Kansas City Symphony, Mahlerfest Symphony Orchestra, Count Basie Orchestra, Brass Band of Battle Creek, Temptations, and Four Tops, as well as extensive national and international conference performances at the Midwest Conference, International Tuba Euphonium Conference, Jazz Educators Network and the William

Adam International Trumpet Seminar. In addition to live music, Ryan has recorded with many gospel artists including on Marvin Sapp's Grammy nominated album *Be Exalted*. From January 2003 to July 2005 Ryan was the lead trumpeter of the Ringling Bros. and Barnum and Bailey Circus performing across the United States and Mexico for over 15 million people. He has performed in concerts, festivals and master classes in Greece, Canada, Mexico, England, Scotland, France, Belgium, Holland and Japan.

About the Band...

The Oklahoma City Symphonic Band's mission is to provide a challenging and enriching musical experience for its members, to offer quality concerts for the community, and to inspire future generations of musicians.

The Oklahoma City Symphonic Band is comprised of approximately one hundred professional and amateur musicians. This historic band has performed in the Oklahoma City area for decades. The members are a cross-section of the community made up of all different professions. They are musicians who find that the band gives them a chance to grow musically.

Rehearsals are held every Tuesday evening throughout the year with the exception of May and August. The Oklahoma City Symphonic Band performs several concerts at a variety of venues including high schools, universities, churches and area parks and has hosted several talented composers as guest clinicians over the years, including Patrick Sheridan in 2014, Dr. Frank Ticheli in 2008, Dr. Jack Stamp in 2006 and Dr. John Zdechlik in 2003. The organization hosts an annual Young Artist Competition for high school students. The students compete by audition for the opportunity to perform with the band and to win a cash prize.

Members volunteer for many positions in the band and on the board of directors for the Foundation to help make the rehearsals and concerts the best experience possible. Oklahoma City Symphonic Band members have found gratification in having the band as an outlet to perform as well as to develop camaraderie with their peers. It is the perfect example of an opportunity for a lifelong continuing education in music.

We welcome new members. Due to the success and growth of our band, we have limits on instrumentation in each section but if a section is full, we will place your name on a waiting list. Our summer season is open to everyone.

The Oklahoma City Symphonic Band Young Artist Competition is open to any wind player or percussionist in the 11th or 12th grade currently enrolled in a high school or home school music program in the state of Oklahoma. Applicants must obtain a recommendation from his or her music director. Exceptions may be made by special request. Applications must be postmarked by Friday, January 31, 2020. Auditions will be held on February 9, 2020 at Oklahoma City University. Memorization is not required but is recommended. Accompanists are required for the audition and are the responsibility of the participant. The winner will receive \$500 and the opportunity to perform his or her solo in concert with the Oklahoma City

Honoring Veterans in our Community!

Norman R. Smith was born at home on a farm Southeast of Kingfisher, OK in 1923. He graduated from Kingfisher High School in May of 1941. That fall he enrolled in a Trade School in Chickasha, OK with the promise of a machinist job after graduation. On Sunday, Dec 7th, 1941 while driving to see his girl friend and later wife, Dorothy Perdue, he heard on his car radio the Japanese had attacked Peal Harbor and knew he would be soon fighting for his country as war had been thrust upon him. As promised, after graduating in March 1942 from the Machinist Trade School with his cousin Pete Mayes, both 19 year olds boarded a train in Kingfisher, OK. After three long hard days on the train they arrived in Bridgeport, CT and their new job at the Remington Arms Ammunition Plant. Their job was to lathe punches used in manufacturing 50 Cal Machine gun bullets or casings. Both Norman and Pete returned to Oklahoma in August,1942 to marry. Norman married his girl friend - Dorothy Perdue returning the next day to Connecticut.

In July 1943 he was called into service, but was allowed to bring his wife back to Oklahoma and report to Fort Sill in Lawton, OK. After a battery of tests he was selected for the Pilot Cadet Program and sent to Amarillo, TX for basic training and later to Santa Anna, CA. He did have some small aircraft flight training, but just before actually starting the Cadet Pilot Training the Army-Air Force decided to cut off the program. Norman was devastated at the time. He was then selected to be a Radio Operator on a large four engine high level Bomber - the B17. He believes some of his testing showed his ability to recognize notes/signals from his high school band/orchestra experience. He has always loved music; especially John Phillip Sousa Marches.

His B-17 training put him on a 10 man crew in Dyersburg, TN. After completing the training they awaited orders to go to Europe, when the Germans surrendered. Norman was then reassigned to a two engine dive bomber - the B -25 and sent to Greensburg, SC with a new crew. After completing that training they were awaiting orders to go to Japan, when President Harry S. Truman dropped the A-Bomb on Japan and the war ended. While the bombings were horrific and killed many Japanese he believes in the end it saved many lives on both sides. Norman served in the Army-Air Force for nearly 2-1/2 years. He will



tell you it was hard and extremely lonely, but he always did his very best and felt he was well trained, prepared, and willing to go to war. He never had a three day pass or much time off, but he values the lessons he learned of being a team player and the value of hard work and training. His advice is to "ALWAYS DO YOUR BEST - Do your part and BE PREPARED!"

After attending Fairmont State University and working for Owens-Illinois Glass, he enlisted in the US Air Force in 1957. He served 30 years as an Air Traffic Controller and retired as a Chief Master Sergeant in 1987. He served in Vietnam in 1970. His medals include: Bronze Star, Meritorious Service w/5 Oak Leaf Clusters, Combat Readiness, Vietnam Service W/4 Oak Leaf Clusters, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross W/Palm, Republic of Vietnam Campaign, Vietnam Medal of Honor II Class and Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon.
